### Reverse Auction

#### Satilla Riverkeeper needs your help!

Water Quality monitoring is a large part of what we do. Our process involves purchasing various chemicals to obtain our results. By upgrading our equipment, we can avoid the purchase and use of multiple chemicals by using a portable YSI electronic water quality meter. Electronic meters will speed up the sampling process, allowing for more sites to be sampled. The Satilla Riverkeeper would like to outfit 2 of our volunteers who sample frequently with electronic water quality meters. In addition, the Riverkeeper is asking for a LaMotte colorimeter. This piece of equipment can be used to determine water quality and test for specific contaminants such as Nitrogen, Phosphate, Potassium, and more! How exciting would it be to have this equipment present when responding to a pollution report? With this equipment upgrade, your Satilla Riverkeeper can provide more water quality information throughout our watershed.
